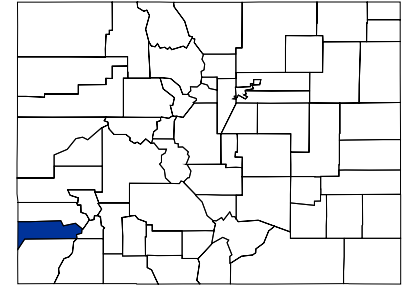

Underservice designations (Health Professional Shortage Area - HPSA, Medically Underserved Area - MUA, etc.) can make an area eligible for certain federal programs and resources; different designation-types work for different programs and resources. Designations can be county-wide, or they can cover a service area within a county. The HPSA designations have to be renewed every 3 or 4 years, while the MUA/MUPs do not (at least currently). While these are federal designations, the Primary Care Office in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, (303) 692-2470, can provide additional information and assist communities with the process. It is extremely difficult to get good estimates of uninsurance rates at the county level. These county estimates use two 'proxies' to estimate levels of uninsurance. The first uses unemployment rates and population estimates, then applies a recognized formula to determine an estimate.

The second method uses data from the Current Population Survey (CPS) administered by the Bureau of Census for each county, along with studies showing the relationship of these variables to estimate uninsurance rates. See the CCMU website for additional details.
